Funding

April 2012 – March 2013 Funding - Total cash budget of \$78,000.

- Real Estate Foundation of BC \$40,000.
- Metro Vancouver \$20,000.
- Fisheries and Oceans Canada \$10,000.
- Watershed Watch Salmon Society/Bullitt Foundation \$ 6,000.
- Port Coquitlam & District Hunting & Fishing Club \$ 2,000.
- Partner Funding with WWSS \$ 2,300.
- Matching in-kind support from Core Committee
- Funding dedicated to key projects: Watershed Plan, Coordinator/Committee support, Website re-development & Virtual Tour, Educational Watershed Café Series, and Outreach/Education events.
